After completing an M.Sc. in ruminant nutrition, Dr. Stookey spent the next five years managing the 1000 ewe sheep flock and research unit at the University of Illinois Dixon Springs Agricultural Center. In 1985 he moved onto campus and managed the Swine Research Centre at the University of Illinois and began work on a Ph.D. During his Ph.D. program, he spent one year in Kenya as a member of the Animal Science Department at Edgerton University, Njoro where he taught basic animal science courses.

Upon completing his Ph.D. in 1991 in the field of applied animal behavior, he accepted a position at the WCVM, where he is today.

As an applied animal behaviorist Dr. Stookey's research has been aimed at improving the productivity and welfare in domestic food animals through the application and investigation of the behavioral processes.

His research program focuses on maternal and social behavior of cattle, investigation of routine painful procedures, plus factors that influence handling and temperament in beef cattle. He also teaches courses to veterinary students on basic animal behavior, animal welfare, and lectures on ethics and pain management.



Dr. Rodrigo Teuber, DVM Technical Services, Americas Pig Improvement Company North America, USA

Dr. Teuber was born and raised in Osorno in Southern Chile. In 2003 he received his veterinarian degree from Universidad Austral de Chile. In 2008, he completed a Diploma in Business and Enterprises Administration in Pontificia Universidad Catolica de Chile in Santiago, Chile.

From 2004-2010 he was Director of Pig Production at Agricola Chorombo, a Chilean company with operations in egg, poultry and pork production. He was in charge of the 3,500 sow farrow-to-finish operation and the expansion to 10,000 sows. He was responsible for pig production administration, overseeing the health program, nutrition, genetic decisions, waste management, and new projects.
