
He graduated from the WCVM in 1981 and received an MBA in Agribusiness from the University of Guelph in 2000. His passion, besides swine health, is gardening.



After graduating from the Ontario Veterinary College at the University of Guelph in 1988, Dr. Harding worked in a mixed animal practice in Humboldt, Saskatchewan. He has specialized in swine since 1991, and in 1997 established a swine consultancy practice, Harding Swine Veterinary Service.
