Current research interests center on the host: microbial interface in the gastrointestinal tract of animals with particular reference to functional feeds and feed additives as alternatives to antibiotics. His laboratory has expertise in gnotobiotic (germ-free) rearing of poultry and pigs, molecular microbial profiling of intestinal microbiota and using gene expression and gut function to study the host-microbial interface.
