

DR. BETTY ALTHOUSE, DVM

Dr. Betty Althouse has been Saskatchewan's Chief Veterinary Officer since 2012.

A Saskatchewan native, she graduated from WCVM in 1982, worked in rural practice with a focus on herd health at Animal Management Services in Humboldt, operated her own swine farm, and worked for CFIA in meat hygiene and animal health before taking on her current role.

Catherine is vice-president of Economic Studies at Groupe AGECO and a partner since 2008. She holds bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics from Université Laval. She is a leading expert in agricultural economy and policies. She is recognized for her acute project design skills, critical sense and strategic thinking to support organizations in the agri-food sector.

She has focused her career on economic and political analysis in the agri-food sector, the collective marketing of agricultural products, international trade and the energy issue.

Jennifer completed her PhD at the University of Guelph in Swine Behaviour in 2009, and moved to Saskatchewan to work at the Prairie Swine Centre (PSC). At the PSC, her research focuses on pressing issues relating to pig behaviour and welfare, such as management of sows in group housing, the use of pain control at castration, transportatiom of nursery and finisher pigs, and on-farm euthanasia methods.

In addition to her research, Jennifer enjoys teaching at the University of Saskatchewan where she is an Adjunct Professor in Animal and Poultry Science. She has also been active on numerous scientific commitees, working with the Canadian Pork Council, National Farm Care Council and National Pork Board (USA) and World Organization for Animal Health (OIE).

Dr. Sylvain Charlebois is a Professor in food distribution and policy in the Faculties of Management and Agriculture at Dalhousie University in Halifax. He is also the Senior Director of the Agri-food Analytics Lab, also located at Dalhousie University.

Known as "The Food Professor", his current research interest lies in the broad area of food distribution, security and safety. He is one of the world's most cited scholars in food supply chain management, food value chains and traceability.

Prior to being Executive Director of the Association, Melissa held the position of Director of Technical Services for over 6 years, responsible for the management of ANAC's HACCP-based FeedAssure program, leading the association's technical and scientific activities dealing with government policy and the regulation of feed industry activities and practices.

Dr. Farmer is a research scientist in sow lactation biology. Dr. Farmer's research goal is to increase sow milk yield, hence piglet growth. She was a pioneer in studying mammary development in gilts and sows and identifying factors affecting it. She published 147 scientific manuscripts and is the sole editor of a recently published book entitled "The gestating and lactating sow" that was also translated and published in Chinese.

Dr. Farmer has been a guest-speaker in 13 European countries, Canada, China and the USA. In 2003 she received the Award for Technical Innovation in Enhancing Production of Safe Affordable Food from the Canadian Society of Animal Science (CSAS) and in 2017 she received the most prestigious award from this society, namely the CSAS Fellowship Award. Dr. Farmer is assistant professor at Laval University and the University of Guelph.

Dr. Volker Gerdts is Director and CEO of the Vaccine and Infectious Disease Organization-International Vaccine Centre (VIDO-InterVac), University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon.

Dr. Gerdts received a DVM in 1994 from Hanover Veterinary School and a German PhD equivalent from the Federal Research Institute for Animal Health, Island of Riems and Hanover Veterinary School, Germany in 1997. He has served in various administrative roles and on various review panels including NIH, NSERC, CIHR, CFI, the Gairdner Foundation, etc.

Dr. Gerdts' research interests are in the area of neonatal vaccines for humans and animals, mucosal immunology, and vaccine delivery and formulation including the development of novel adjuvants and the use of large animal models for human diseases.
