



John's research focuses on supply and utilization of energy in swine diets, but more recently, he has been concentrating on fat and fibre utilization and metabolism. His interest in fibre has turned into an even more recent focus on how diet composition affects factors related to gut health, specifically how the diet can impact the pig's ability to resist or tolerate exposure to certain pathogens. John also consults extensively in pig nutrition and management across North and South America as well as Europe and Asia.
